THE TOTAL LAND MASS THAT IS UNDER AMERICAN INDIAN OR ALASKA NATIVE CONTROL IS AROUND 100 MILLION ACRES. COLLECTIVELY, INDIAN COUNTRY WOULD BE THE MILLION 42ND BIGGEST STATE.²


ABUNDANT DIVERSITY

PHILANTHROPY EFFORTS IN INDIAN COUNTRY

Only 0.4% on average of philanthropic funding is directed to Native communities out of all philanthropic funding by large U.S. foundations.7

OF PHILANTROPIC FUNDING GOES TO NATIVE COMMUNITIES

A 2018 STUDY DONE BY THE FIRST NATIONS DEVELOPMENT INSTITUTE FOUND THAT **NEGATIVE STEREOTYPES, RESISTANCE TO INCLUSION OF NATIVE CAUSES, AND RAPIDLY** SHIFTING PRIORITIES ARE ALL BARRIERS TO PHILANTHROPIC FUNDING FOR NATIVE COMMUNITIES. 7
